Geoff's Usual Coco mix for Cymbidiums

As discussed at our March meeting the mix I use generally for cymbidiums in 125mm to 300mm pots is:

1 block tropicool coco "profit" grade

Soak for at least 4 hours in 70 litre garbage bin of tap water , drain , repeat 3 times Optionally on the last soak add 20mls Peters Excel Cal Mag finisher - mix in water first

Then add 20 litres coarse perlite

1 cup dolomite

Mix thoroughly

When I pot up I add some slow release fertilizer - I use Peters exact hi k 8-9 month

5ml in 125mm pot

10ml in a 175mm pot

15ml in a 200mm pot

20ml in a 250mm pot

As always I recommend a small trial in your growing conditions with your watering and with just a few plants before any massive change is made .

MINUTES OF 9th APRIL, 2023

The was meeting opened at 8pm by President, Geoff Le Marne, who welcomed Members and visitors.

April meeting is the AGM, July will be the Winter Show, August the Extravaganza (so no meeting), September will be the Spring Show. In October we are hoping to have Steve Dunstan from the Central Coast speaking on canaliculatum growing and November will be the Christmas Party.

David Brooks spoke on the fabulous flowering of Penny Serenade by Ken and Sharyon Wynn at our October meeting. They were awarded an Award of Merit at the Club last year and were presented with an Award of Merit from the Orchid Society of NSW tonight for the same plant. Both the Cymbidium Club and OSNSW have also awarded the plant an Award of Cultural Excellence.

The meeting broke for supper at 8.30pm and resumed at 8.50pm.

Geoff gave a presentation of different growing media and there was general discussion on that topic, as well as fertilizing regimes.
